The Irish Shows Association are proud to present the following Championships and wishes to acknowledge the generous sponsorships, which make these competitions possible. For the efficient running of the championships all concerned are requested to read and observe the Rules set out below.

GENERAL RULES FOR ISA CHAMPIONSHIPS

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS: Shows wishing to participate in the 2025 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle, and Sheep class prize money for the year 2025 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable. Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships. These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS): Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS:

- a. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
 - b. The qualifier class should be held as the first (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
 - c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
 - d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
 - e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. The ISA will award a rosette to the successful Qualifiers on appearance at the final.
 - f. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the final other than by agreement with the ISA. "However Shows who hold qualifiers for Horses, Ponies & Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show on the day"
 - g. Animals qualified for finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.
 - h. Shows should appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
 - i. Animal Passports & "Micro Chips where applicable" should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
 - j. On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
 - k. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
 - l. Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association with three (3) days following the holding of the show.
- N.B. Shows must return results card marked "No Competition" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS:

- a. Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under f. below.
- b. Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above, within one hour of qualifying.
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championship and not the sponsor involved.
- f. Objections must be lodged in writing with the Show Secretary or with the I.S.A representative at the show within half an hour of the completion of judging, together with a fee of €50, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- g. Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded.

E. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS:

- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within 30 days of the final.
- b. Championship finals should start not later than 2pm on the day of the show and the advertised time of starting should be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

Discipline

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour.

Inappropriate behaviour shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges, exhibitors or other Show officials
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine judges or other officials before, during or following Member Show activities
- Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions
- Abusing any animal

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

Procedure:

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours.

A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from the date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said complaint; such reply shall be made in writing.

Both parties shall state whether an oral hearing of the complaint is sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to hold an oral hearing in regard to the complaint whether or not sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall decide in each case whether to hold such an oral hearing in respect of the complaint, or any part thereof and there shall be no appeal from such decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

The Disciplinary Committee shall, at any time, seek further information from either party. In the event of either party refusing or failing to provide such further information within the time specified by the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee shall be entitled to make a decision on the complaint and/or to hold an oral hearing of the complaint in the absence of a copy of such further information being received by the Disciplinary Committee from either party.

The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to reject a complaint where, in the opinion of the Committee, it finds there is no basis for it.

Sanctions:

In the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed to be proved against the offender, the Disciplinary Committee shall issue a written warning to the offender. In the event of any subsequent incident, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose sanctions on the offender, including a prohibition on such offender participating in any of the events/activities at any Member Show of the ISA, provided always that in the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed by the Disciplinary Committee to constitute gross misbehaviour, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the offender as it deems appropriate, including the prohibition on such offender from participating in any of the events/activities of any Member Show of the ISA.

The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final.

RULES & REGULATION

1. NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED IN ANY CLASS WITHOUT ENTRY FEE.
2. ALL Entry forms must be signed.
3. All exhibits must be exhibitor's own production.
4. All classes are open (Except where specified).
5. In the event of insufficient entries in any one class, the Society reserve the right to use their discretion with regards to prize money.
6. Judges may withhold prizes where exhibitors do not show sufficient merit.
7. In all classes exhibitors must supply their own boxes or plates where necessary.
8. Entries may be delivered to the Centre on the Saturday evening before the Show between 7 - 9 pm or on the morning of the Show between 8 - 10 am.
9. No exhibit may be removed before 3:30 pm on Show Day. No prize will be paid in Livestock Section if exhibit is removed before 3:30 pm.
10. All prizes to be paid within 45 days of Show.
11. Entries will be accepted via our website www.clonasleeshow.com or on printed forms only.
12. Latest date for receipt of entries Friday 5th September 2025
13. The committee will not be responsible for any accident of any exhibit, exhibitor or agent of exhibitor, and shall not entertain any claim for compensation or otherwise, on any grounds whatsoever.
14. All exhibits in Animal Section must be accompanied by attendants and remain under care of such attendant during the Show – who will be solely responsible for his charge.
15. Exhibitors shall provide cattle, horse, and sheep with adequate halters. All cattle must be trained to lead and tie.
16. NOTICE: All animals must have the appropriate tag and card and be within the T.B. Test Limit laid down by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry.
17. The decision of the Judges to be final and the instructions of stewards and officials must be obeyed at all times.
18. All cups and trophies are perpetual and must be returned.
19. Objection must be lodged in writing to the show secretary together with fee of €20 within Half an hour following judging of the class concerned refundable in the event of the objection being held.

DOG LEASHING, MUZZLING AND ID TAG LAWS (as applies to public places)

The laws regarding dogs under the Control of Dogs Regulations 1998 came into operation on February 1, 1999.

Leashing and Muzzling.

5. (1) This article shall apply to every:-

- (a) American Pitt Bull Terrier
- (b) Bull Mastiff
- (c) Doberman Pinscher
- (d) English Bull Terrier
- (e) German Shepherd (Alsatian)
- (f) Japanese Akita
- (g) Japanese Tose
- (h) Rhodesian Ridgeback
- (i) Rottweiler

(j) Staffordshire Bull Terrier, and to every dog of the type commonly known as a Ban Dog (or Bandog) and to every other strain or cross of every breed or type of dog described in this article.

(2) A person shall not permit a dog to which this article applies to be in a public place unless such dog is: -

- (i) securely muzzled and
- (ii) being led by a sufficiently strong chain or leash, not exceeding two meters in length, by a person over the age of sixteen years who is capable of controlling the said dog.

Identification of Ownership of Dogs.

6. (1) The owner or other person in charge of a dog shall ensure that such dog shall at all times wear a collar bearing the name and address of the owner inscribed thereon, or on a plate, badge or disc attached thereto.

(2) No person shall in any manner alter, deface, mutilate or render illegible the particulars prescribed under sub-article (1) to be inscribed on a collar to be worn by a dog, or on a plate, badge or disc to be attached thereto, which has been altered, defaced, mutilated or rendered illegible as aforesaid or upon which the particulars have become illegible.

(3) A breach of any provision of this article shall be an offence to which Section 28 (1) of the Act applies.
